

PLEASE READ THE GUIDELINES CAREFULLY

GENERAL RULES AND PROCEDURES

VENDOR DEFINITION

- Merchandise – Vendor selling items that are prepackaged.
- Vendor selling any cooked/baked food; brisket, turkey legs, fajita, chicken, potatoes, funnel cakes, cotton candy, fried desserts, oversized beverages such as lemonade, raspas, ice cream, etc.
- Food vendors MAY NOT sell anything other than food or drinks, NO Un-consumables!
- **Vendors MAY NOT SELL OR BRING ANY Alcoholic Beverages of any kind!**
- **Any Oil being used MUST be taken with you; NO OIL DUMPING IS ALLOWED ON -SITE! IF CAUGHT SUBJECT WILL BE FINED AND WILL NOT BE ALLOWED TO PARTICATE IN ANY OTHER CITY EVENT!**

Vendors are allowed to bring a pop-up tent or concession trailer, tables , chairs, barbeque pit and other set-up displays for their booth that DO NOT exceed the space provided. The dimensions are 10' x 10' for Food Vendors and 10' x 10' for Merch Vendors.

Vendors Must Display their COMPLETE MENU with PRICING.

Vendors are required to get a Health Permit from Cameron County (\$25).

Food Vendors WILL NOT be allowed to set-up without a Health Permit from Cameron County

All Food Vendors must display their Health Department Permit at their booth with their booth number

OBJECTIONABLE MATERIAL

Anyone selling or distributing objectional materials to the public and not in conformity to the the Bridge-Fest rules will not be allowed to participate and will be asked to leave. The Bridge-Fest planning committee reserves the right to determine what is considered objectionable items. Objectionable items include, but are not limited to the following:

- **Knives or items resembling knives**
- **Guns or items resembling guns**
- **Bullets or items resembling bullets**
- **Lighters or flammable materials**
- **Materials depicting marijuana, other illegal drugs, or drug related paraphernalia**
- **Items resembling cigarettes**

Although these items may be considered legal for sale, the Bridge-Fest Planning Committee is concerned with their sale to minors. Vendors are asked to use good judgment and consider parental/guardian approval before selling what may be considered "objectionable" items to minors.
